Independent Custody Visiting Association Checklist for Independent Custody Visitors Strip and Intimate Searching Children October 2020



Background

Schemes have asked ICVA (via the NEF) ICVA to produce a briefing regarding strip searching with specific note on what <u>PACE Code C Annexe A</u> says on both strip and intimate searching for children and young people (any detainee aged 17 or under). This checklist is designed to accompany the briefing, and has a particular focus on custody records as ICVs will not be present at a search.

When you arrive in custody			
	Prioritise visits to children.		
	ring your visit		
	Check on rights, entitlements and wellbeing as you would for any visit.		
Ц	If the detainee is a child, ask them if they have been subject to a search (being sensitive not to elicit details which may make the child embarrassed or		
	uncomfortable).		
	Ask the detainee if you are able to check the custody record.		
Strip Search - When looking at the custody record (with permission)			
	Check that the rationale for the search is fully recorded.		
	Check the location of the search and that it was not able to be seen by others in		
	the suite.		
	Check that the names and gender of those present at the search is recorded.		
	Check to see if the AA was present, and if they were not, that either:		
	o This was at the request of the child, the child's decision was recorded with		
	the signature of the AA in agreement.		
	 If the search was considered urgent and therefore went ahead prior to the arrival of the AA, the reason for urgency was recorded. 		
	 A note has been made of attempts to get an AA in attendance as soon as possible. 		
	Check that the result of the search is recorded.		
Int	Intimate Search - When looking at the custody record (with permission)		
	Check that the rationale for the search is fully recorded.		
	Check the location of the search and that it was not able to be seen by others in		
	the suite.		

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
