PLEASE NOTE CLARIFICATION: If a detained person leaves the custody suite and is admitted to hospital then the section 40 PACE reviews continue, however the section 42 relevant time does stop unless questions continue. The section 40 review ensures continued detention is necessary whilst the person is in hospital.
