Please note that as per PACE Code C (5.6) – the right to a phone call is a explicitly mentioned and therefore the right to monitor ("The detainee shall be given writing materials, on request, and **allowed to telephone one person for a reasonable time**..."). This is a right that may be delayed or denied by an officer of inspector rank or above for a limited number of reasons.
